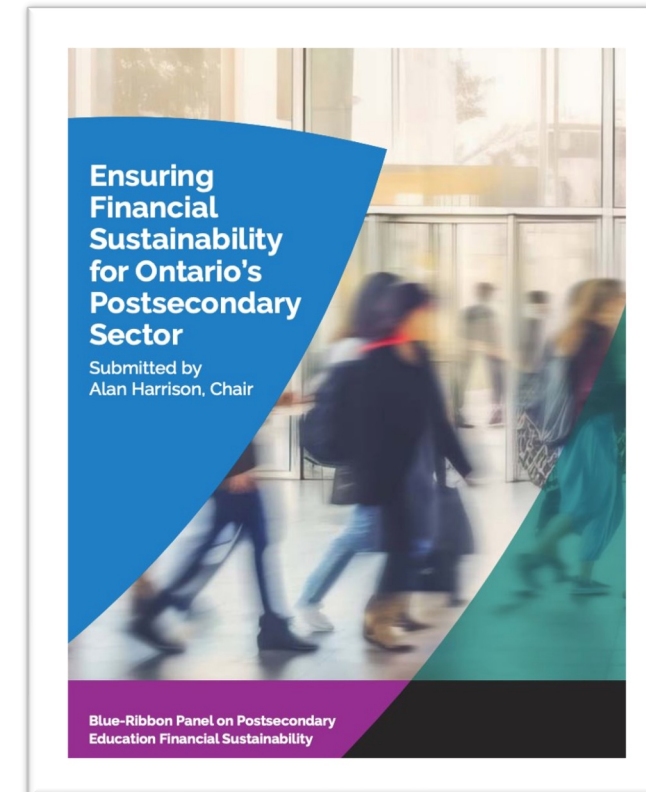

Last Monday:

- 3-year continued freeze on tuition for Ontario students
- \$700M to operating base split between universities and colleges with typically ~66% going to universities – over the next 3 years.
 - Not a permanent increase in grant
- \$203M to help institutions with greater financial need (eligibility TBD)
- \$100M to support STEM programs costs at institutions with enrolments above currently funded levels (not expected to be eligible)
- Efficiencies fund
- Tuition anomalies adjustments will continue:
 - Business, Engineering, Law



Federal Announcement: International Visa Caps and Process

- IRCC announced a 2-year intake cap on international student permit applications.
- **Applicants to Masters and PhD degrees are exempt** - as are current study permit holders.
- 35% decrease in approved study permits in 2024 compared to last year.
- Our undergraduate international students will need attestation letter from the provinces:
 - Process to be established by March 31 - until then, the approval process is paused.
- Caps are being allocated to each province based on population:
 - Ontario's allocation ~235K applications of which IRCC is projecting 141K approvals.
 - MCU is modelling that universities will receive 20% or 47K applications (28.2K permits).
 - We have plenty of space available – given our current undergraduate international students.



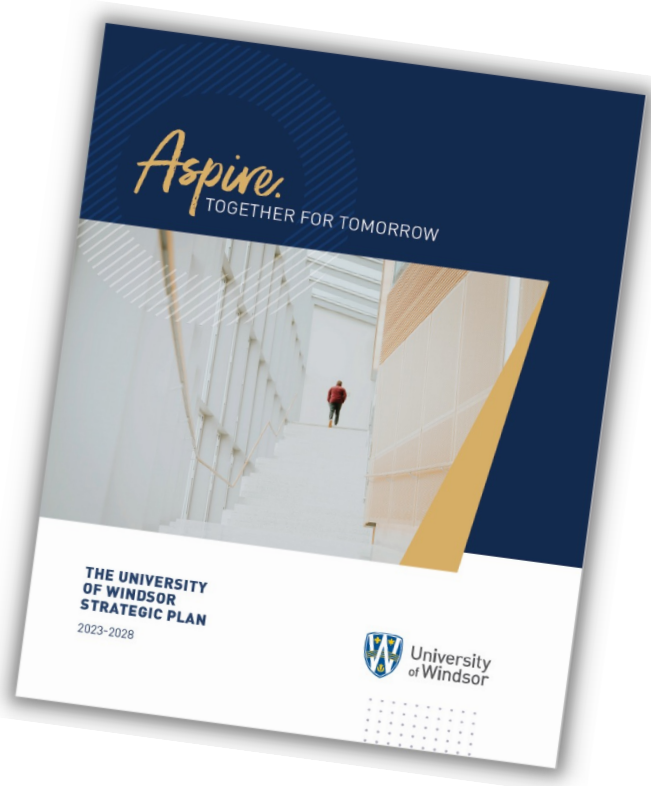

 - Establishing an Indigenous faculty recruitment initiative that will be aligned with the Indigenous Strategic Plan



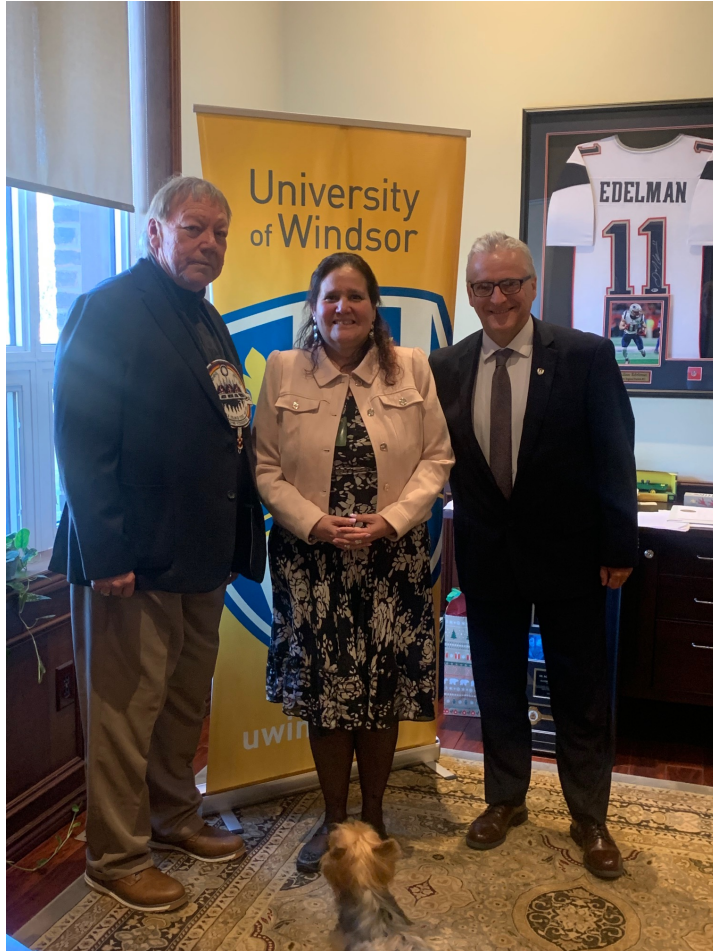

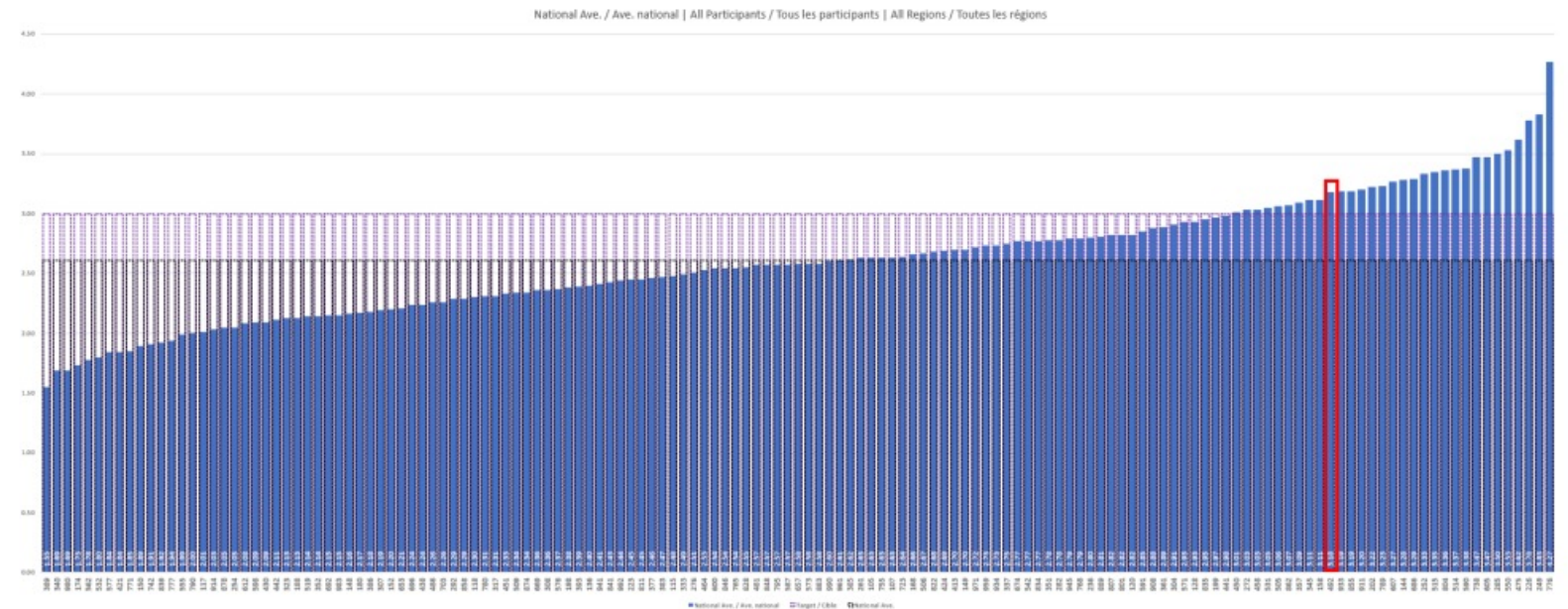
