The President provided an update on budget planning, including a new zero-based budgeting approach; campus infrastructure projects; and Indigenous initiatives. The President also reported on provincial and national varsity sporting events hosted at the Toldo Lancer Centre; Spring Convocation dates and events, including honorary degree recipients; and the ratification of the Unifor 2458 FT and PT office and clerical staff collective agreements.

In response to a suggestion that savings may be found with closing of buildings, it was noted that this would result in one-time savings and would not address base, structural budget needs. Long-term revenue streams like 3P partnerships, renting space, etc., should be the focus. An example of this is the early negotiations with a private partner to install solar panels on the roof of CEI. It was also suggested that Essex Hall Theatre could be rented out for community events when it is not in use by the University.

It was agreed that the Associate Vice-President, Information Technology Services report on the new MS 365 storage restrictions at the next Senate meeting.

Congratulations were extended to Dr. Sarah Woodruff, Associate Dean of Academic Programs, Faculty of Human Kinetics, and Ms. Ghallia Hashem, President of the UWSA, recipients of the 2025 YMCA Women of Excellence Award.

Along with the ongoing reorganization of Research and Innovation Services, members were informed that the office the VPRI is reviewing its internal policies and research management systems for effectiveness and efficiencies. Graduate Studies will ensure that the minimum funding guaranteed is clearly stated in the offer of admission so that potential students can make an informed decision about whether to attend the University based on the funding that will be provided.
