5.8 Report of the Provost

Senators were informed that *The Conversation* (which is an online academic publication that the University has joined) is growing in popularity and interest which is positive for the University. *The Conversation* is an excellent publication for ensuring that faculty research and creative activity has a reach and impact, nationally and internationally.

Members were informed that the United Way's *On Track to Success* program has been instrumental in helping at-risk students achieve long-term success in post-secondary education. The program identifies young students beginning at the Grade 8 level who are at risk of completing higher education (for example, students from low income families) and provides outreach and support through mentoring, tutoring, counselling and programming.

The United Way has developed partnerships with the University of Windsor and St. Clair College. Students in the program are eligible to receive a \$4,000 bursary as part of the *On Track to Success* program to attend a post-secondary institution. The University of Windsor offers an additional \$4000 over the duration of four years.
