**NOTICE RE: TEACHING ASSISTANT (TA) POSITIONS AVAILABLE FOR FALL TERM 2020**

In accordance with Article 12:01 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement the Department of Sociology, Anthropology & Criminology invites applications for TA positions for the Fall term 2020. The projected total hours for Teaching Assistantships allocated to the Department of Sociology, Anthropology & Criminology for the 2020 Fall academic term is 900 hours.

**Note that Teaching Assistants cannot be employed for more than 100 hours per semester total.** If you already hold or have applied for another TA position (in this or another department) note that the total combined hours for all TA appointments held in all departments cannot exceed 100 hours. The 100 hours worked is during the entire period of Sept. 1 to Dec. 31. Refer to Articles 12, 13, and 14 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement for eligibility details.

**Expected TA duties:**

- Administration of student evaluation of teaching (SET).
- All GAs and TAs hired are required to complete a **one-time** training for **new employees**, [www.uwindsor.ca/requiredtraining](http://www.uwindsor.ca/requiredtraining), and provide proof of completion to the Department.
- Other duties as agreed with the course instructor (Form 1). Examples: marking, holding office hours, attending virtual classes, etc.
- All duties will be performed remotely

**Eligibility requirements:**

TA appointments shall be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:04 of the Collective Agreement. To be eligible for a Teaching Assistantship you must be a registered student:

- must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring
- must maintain registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program

**Required essential qualifications:**

- must have access to a computer with a reliable internet connection with video and audio capabilities.
- must be familiar with Blackboard and MS Teams or be able to acquire knowledge through training.
- Cumulative academic average of 75% or higher
- must be available to attend virtual classes/labs/exams

**Preferred qualifications:**

- Preference will be given to individuals who have taken the course before
- Cumulative academic average of 80% or higher

Department Deadline: All applications must be received in the department no later than **Friday, August 7, 2020 by 4:00pm**.
