Code of Conduct for Education Loans	The Code of Conduct for Education Loans prohibits a conflict of interest with the responsibilities of an agent of the school with respect to private education loans. The code of conduct specifically prohibits:  - Revenue-sharing arrangements with any lender  - Receiving gifts from a lender, a guarantor, or a loan service  - Contracting arrangements providing financial benefit from any lender or affiliate of a lender  - Directing borrowers to particular lenders, or refusing or delaying loan certifications  - Accepting offers of funds for private loans  - Call center or financial aid office staffing assistance  - Advisory board compensation
