




Develop Your Budget

- A budget compares income to expenses, and keeps personal spending accountable
- Create a budget that matches your estimated resources with your expenses
- Use a daily log to track your spending
- Reflect on your expenses:
 - → Education costs
 - Accommodation costs
 - Transportation costs

- Food and Clothing
- → Personal well-being
- Entertainment
- Consider your priorities and establish realistic goals and expectations
- How much debt are you comfortable with? Consider your personal situation

Saving:

 UWin card discounts; Opt out – Drug and Dental Plan; Bus Pass; TLC Gym membership; Book Buy Back at the Campus Bookstore; Students Offering Support (\$20+ fee: https://windsor.soscampus.com), S.T.E.P.S., Leddy Library Data Centre, and Leddy Library Writing Desk all offer academic assistance; Additionally, almost all departments offer free or affordable tutoring services; Food Pantry.

Ignite is the University of Windsor's Work Study program and funds part-time jobs for students. These jobs are usually on campus and are flexible around class schedules.

Automatic Entrance Scholarships

- Students are automatically considered for university open entrance scholarships.
 - **Conditional offers** are made based on a student's final grade 11 and minimum 3 interim and/or final U/M level grades. Students will receive an early financial aid offer with their offer of admission if their early admission average falls within our scholarship range. Conditional offers do not translate to final offers if a student does not maintain the average that is required for a final offer to stand.
 - Final offers are made based on a student's interim and/or final Grade 12 (120) courses generally available in May.
 - Final offers are reviewed at the end of July, once final grades are in. If final grades improve, scholarship offers will be increased. Final offers communicated in May will not be adjusted if final grades go down.
 - Minimum levels of support:
 - 85% 89.99% \$1000 University of Windsor Entrance Scholarship (\$1,000)
 - 90% 94.99% \$10,000 Dean's Level Entrance Scholarship (\$1,250 x 8 terms)
 - 95% 100% \$16,000 President's Level Entrance Scholarship (\$2,000 x 8 terms)
- What happens if we receive a student's 120 prior to May?
 - The first 120 average we receive is the average that sets the scholarship offer.
 - It may change in May, then again in July only if the average goes up.



Applying for Scholarship & Bursaries

- With the student's offer of admission, there will be a financial aid letter with the link to apply for entrance scholarships and bursaries.
 - Entrance award by application portal (UWinAward Profile/Application) opened January 1, 2023.
 - All application-based scholarships and bursaries Deadline: April 30, 2023

Over 140 additional scholarships and bursaries that students can be considered for ranging from \$500 to \$80,000 (over 4 years).

In-Course Funding Opportunities

After being admitted, students may be eligible for additional assistance in the form of in-course funding opportunities. As previously mentioned, an application will be required for these university scholarships and bursaries.

- The UWinAward Profile will again be made available in August.
- The sooner the application is completed, the better! Awards start to be adjudicated in early November and early submission by mid to end of October will guarantee consideration for all awards.
- Donor Sponsored Awards are part of the UWinAward Profile process and provide both merit and needs based scholarships and bursaries.

Needs Based Bursaries – these bursaries require students to demonstrate financial need. To do so, students must apply for financial aid and have at least \$1 of need as determined in their government financial aid application.







Outstanding Scholars

- Provides an opportunity to conduct research in partnership with a professor, outside the classroom. Students are paid to work in a research placement for up to six semesters.
- During that time you have the opportunity to be mentored in your discipline.
- Competitive approximately 100 scholarships will be awarded after application through the UWinAward process. Minimum entering average required is 85%
- \$1500 scholarship in first year (\$750 x 2 terms) only
- Years 2-4, eligible students may have the opportunity to work with Faculty on research related projects (students are invited to apply for admission into the OUTS program after successful completion of their first year)








Ontario Student Assistance Program

- Ontario administers a student aid program that assists students with financing their post-secondary studies.
- The application is generally available in May and we encourage students to apply by the end of June.
- With one application, students will be considered for OSAP, which includes:
 - Grants, bursaries, and scholarships = non-repayable aid (you keep)
 - Loans = repayable aid (you pay back)







Example of how OSAP aid is determined

Educational Costs \$15,000 Expected Financial Contribution \$3,600

A mix of grant and loan is provided

As income increases, the share of aid that is non-repayable goes down

How to Apply to OSAP

Full-time Applications:

In order to apply for **full-time** financial aid funding, a student must be enrolled in at least a 60% course load (*usually* this equates to 3 – three credit courses per semester). For students with a permanent disability, they are eligible for full-time funding if taking a 40% course load.

Part-Time Applications:

Students registered in less than a 60% course load are eligible to apply for part-time funding and must submit the part-time OSAP application form.

Students with a documented permanent, persistent or prolonged disability are eligible for part-time funding if registered in a minimum 20% course load, maximum 40% course load. At a 40% course load, these students can request either part-time or full-time funding.

For Ontario permanent residents, simply complete an online OSAP application at: ontario.ca/osap and carefully follow the instructions





Registrar's Office – Enrolment Verification


Financial institutions require a proof of enrolment document to process the withdrawal of Registered Educational Savings Plan (RESP) funds. We refer to this as an Enrolment Verification letter.



At the University of Windsor, Enrolment Verification Letters are

available for download via the student portal.

- Click on the My Academics Tile
- Click on Self Service Letters
- Select Enrollment Verification Letter
