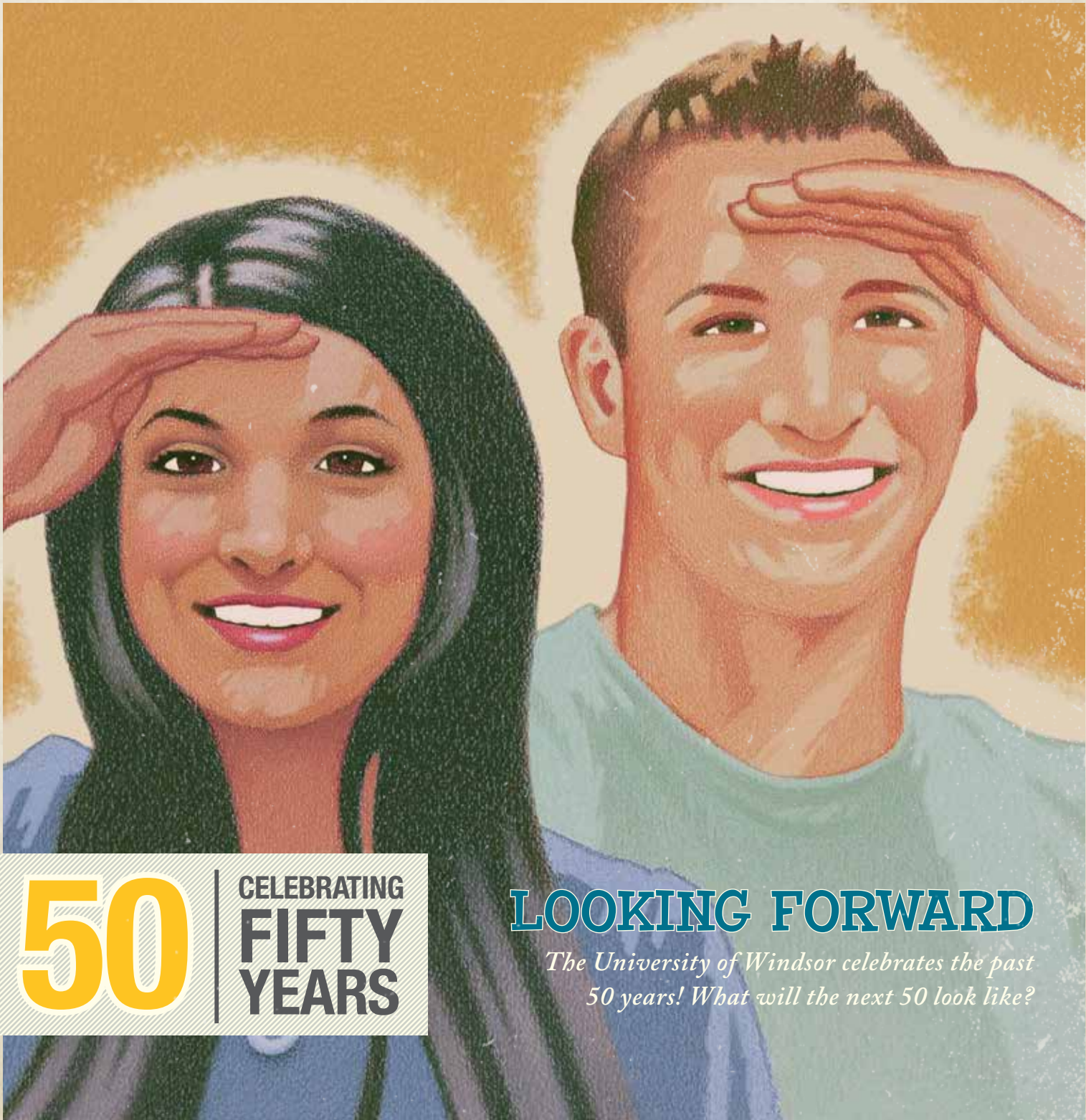

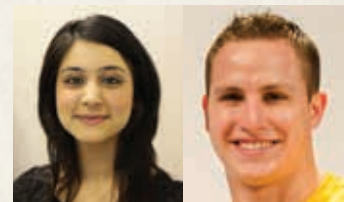

Our French Connection

LAYING THE FOUNDATION FOR A UNIVERSITY

Long before there were any classrooms or laboratories on the land where the University of Windsor now sits, education of a slightly less formal variety had been taking place for years, according to a local historian.

In 1748, French Jesuit missionaries relocated their mission from Ille-aux-Bois-Blancs (Boblo Island) to the land now occupied by the University's main campus, after the Wyandot (also known as Huron) confederacy deeded it to them.

Over the next several years, the French Crown granted tracts of land to settlers on the south shore of the Detroit River in Petite Côte—now known as LaSalle—as well as the property stretching east to Windsor's present day downtown, a settlement eventually known as L'Assomption de la Pointe de Montréal.

It was the children of these settlers—people with surnames like Gaudette, Drouillard, Mailloux and Reaume still common in the area today—who walked to the mission for their lessons with the priests.

"Besides religious services, the priests also offered educational lessons for the children of farmers wealthy enough to pay for them," says Guillaume Teasdale, a sessional instructor in history.

Originally from Trois-Rivières, Quebec, Dr. Teasdale moved here to teach about two years ago. He specializes in 18th-century Canadian history, focusing on the complexities of French and British attempts to colonize the St. Lawrence Valley and Great Lakes regions.

He's especially enthusiastic about the history of Windsor and Detroit, and says there are great volumes of archival data, including about 50,000 pages of land titles, marriage records, and other government documents that he has found at the Detroit Public Library.

"It's been barely used by local historians," he says. "Many documents were handwritten in French, so a lot of people can't read them. It's very exciting to discover so many sources that haven't been tapped, and there's still so much to look at."

When he travels along Riverside Drive adjacent to the Detroit River, Teasdale can envision what it looked like in the days after French explorer Antoine Laumet de La Mothe, sieur de Cadillac founded the Fort of Detroit in 1701. He can see rows of farms on the north shore of the river, in what is now downtown Detroit,

which the French Crown began by granting to settlers from the St. Lawrence valley in 1734. When he arrives on campus, he can imagine what it may have looked like here, too.

"There's very little evidence, but I believe there would have been a few buildings," he says. "There was a church, a residence and probably a barn, because the missionaries would have had livestock."

One of the few pieces of visual evidence is a painting (above) by Edward Walsh that depicts the property in 1804 and shows one of three churches that stood there before the present-day Assumption Church was constructed in 1845.

"That church was built by the Sulpicians in the 1780s," Teasdale says of the painting, part of the collection in the University of Michigan's Clements Library. It is also found in the book, *Frontier Metropolis: Picturing Early Detroit, 1701-1838*.

When the mission moved from Boblo, about 600 Wyandot would visit regularly, but their numbers dwindled by 1800, Teasdale says. In their place, more settlers arrived, especially after the parish expanded its boundaries about 10 kilometres eastward to modern-day Tecumseh, Ont., between 1768 and 1796.

"I guess they just didn't feel that close to the French," Teasdale says of the Wyandot peoples. "There was no inter-marrying between them and the missionaries may have lost interest in them because they had French settlers to focus on."

As the parish expanded, the need for a formal school was recognized and in 1855, construction of Assumption College began. It opened on Feb. 10, 1857 to 26 boarders and 60 day students, offering classes in three departments: primary, classical and mercantile.

"So many colleges were being established in the U.S. in the mid-19th century," says Teasdale. "It was part of that movement and it was obvious to them that this was a great location."

Assumption College was established by the Jesuits, but transferred control to the Basilian Fathers after just seven months. It changed its name to Assumption University in 1956, before entering into a federation with the University of Windsor when it was established in 1963.

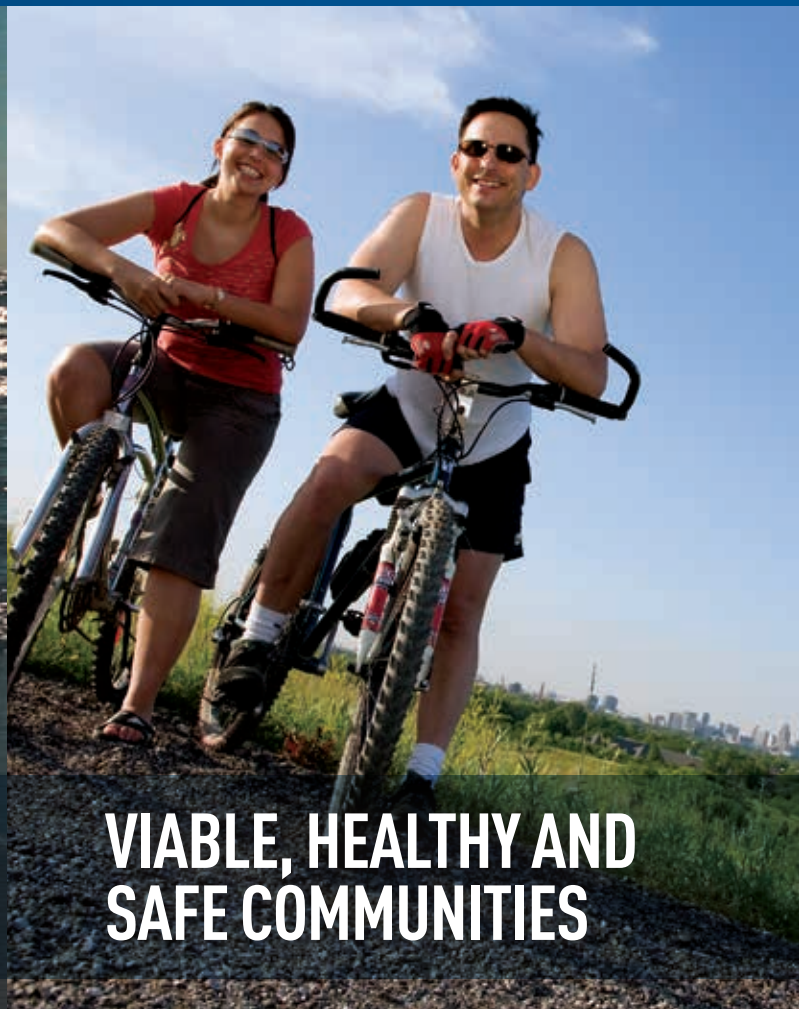
As for Teasdale, he says that he hopes to continue his teaching and delve deeper into the area's history. "It's a very interesting place to be. The history of this area is very rich and very complex." **V**

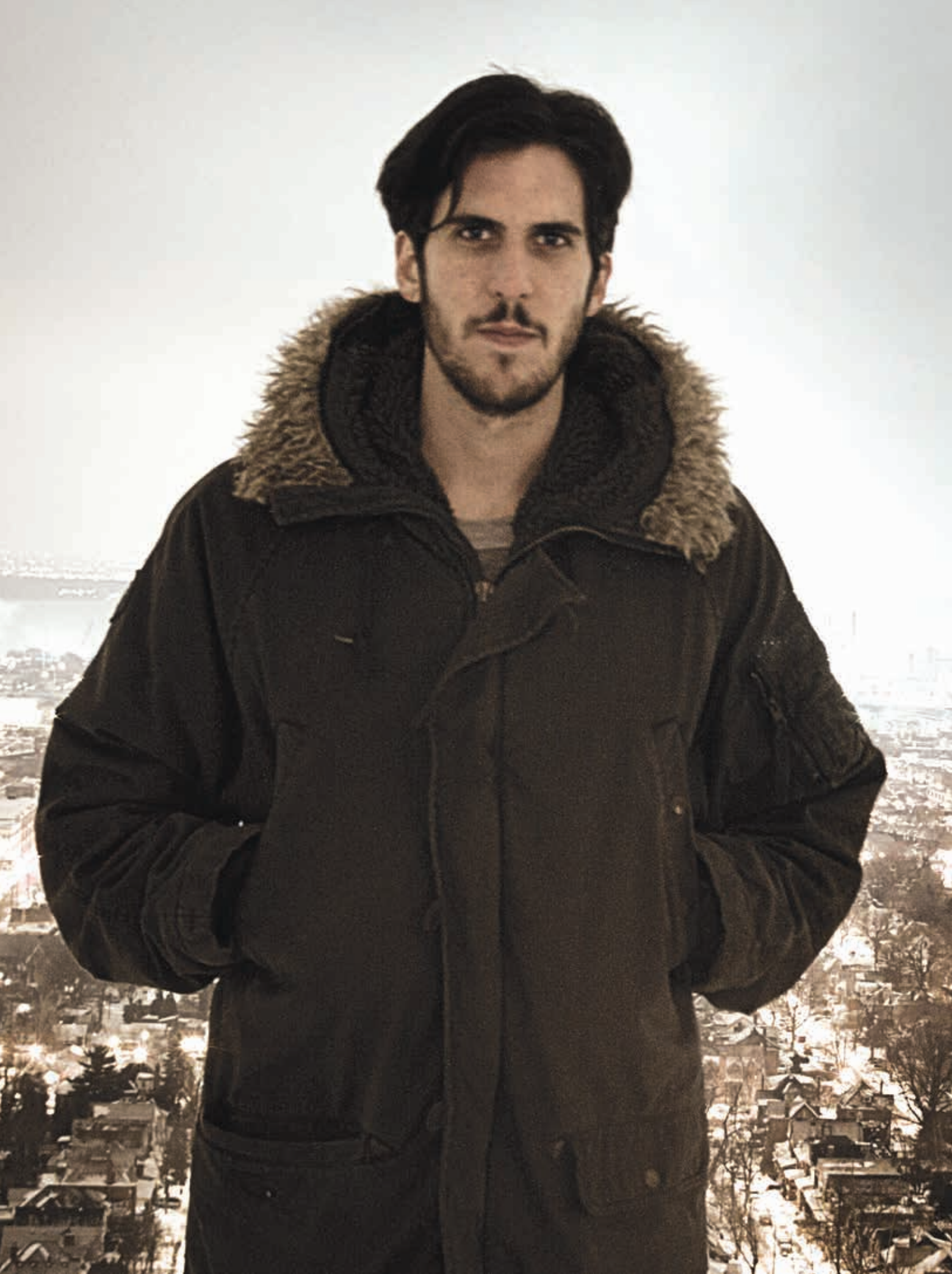

STUDENT PROFILE

DAN GRIFFIN

The Law School of Rock

Balance. Discipline. Leadership. Advocacy. Empathy. Focus. Those are the values and skills that third-year law student Dan Griffin says he is learning in class and that will form the foundation of his career as a lawyer...in the music business.

Griffin has a head start on that goal: he was a member of Arkells, the Juno Award-winning indie band that he left temporarily in October 2011 to attend the University of Windsor's Faculty of Law.

"I thought that pursuing something like a law degree in particular could really enhance my career," Griffin says.

Growing up, he was surrounded by the twin influences of law and music. His father and uncle are partners in a real estate and mortgage firm in Mississauga, Ont. His father also plays guitar and his mother sings. Griffin says that his father taught him "you don't have to choose between music and law—it's how to balance the two."

Realistically, the move from stage to school is one that most aspiring rock stars would never consider. The band had just released its second album, "Michigan Left," and enjoyed a growing buzz in the wake of its 2010 Juno Award for New Group, earned for its 2008 debut, "Jackson Square." A few months after Griffin left, Arkells claimed a second Juno as 2012 Group of the Year. For Griffin, however, the decision came down to the desire to take the skills he had learned in one arena and transfer them to another. He says that Arkells provided him with a dawning appreciation of the complexity of the business side of music—dealing with managers, agents, record labels, and studios. Griffin, who had also worked summers in his uncle and father's law firm, began to realize how a law degree could be a powerful asset.

"I hope to offer something unique to people in the industry: the credibility of someone who has both a legal and music background."

Arkells, named after a street in Hamilton, Ont., formed as a group of McMaster University students who came from different parts of Ontario. A Mississauga native and keyboardist, Griffin was considered by many to be a key part of the band's success. One newspaper music critic called him, "the musical glue that holds everything together," and the group's "Renaissance man," who could play several instruments, sing and compose.

Griffin has recorded both as a member of Arkells and a solo artist. He released a 2011 solo album, "Leave Your Love". Available on iTunes and through his website www.dangriffin.ca, "Leave Your Love" is a mellower, more introspective work, tinged with folk writing influences from the likes of Leonard Cohen, Paul Simon, and Bob Dylan. One song, "Lorne Park", was used in an episode of the TV show "Rookie Blue" that aired in June 2013, and the opening track "Stars and Satellites" was the music of a Canadian Tire holiday commercial. This past August, he released a new EP, "Bordertown", which he says was heavily influenced by his life in Windsor.

Christopher Waters, who served as associate dean when Griffin started law school, calls him "an unassuming, friendly guy who dived into the study of law and worked hard." Waters says Griffin, "never gave the impression that he would rather be doing music and was at law school because it was the 'sensible' thing to do." And yet sensible is exactly how Griffin pursues life and the opportunities that come his way.

Griffin says he still enjoys "performing" in front of an audience, no matter if in concert or courtroom. "I think whether it's up on stage or on my own, or even standing up and giving oral submissions for a moot for a case in school—I get the same sort of thrill." **V**

New Image Reflects Proud Heritage

On the occasion of its 50th anniversary, the University of Windsor has launched a new logo that incorporates a sense of pride in its rich history with modern elements that represent the excitement the campus feels for the next 50 years. The new blue and gold logo depicts the shield from the University of Windsor's coat of arms, paired with a modern font in light grey.

"With our 50th anniversary celebrations approaching, it was time to look carefully at our identity and the image we project to the world," says president Alan Wildeman. "The new logo was developed entirely in-house. It reflects the pride we have in our heritage, and the opportunity to strengthen our identity for current and future students as our campus transformation goes forward."

The shield represents a stylized version of UWindsor's coat of arms from 1963, which uses symbols originally taken from

its predecessor Assumption College, founded in 1857. The fleur-de-lis is symbolic of the French-Canadian heritage of Windsor-Essex as well as the Basilian order. The lily is a heraldry icon representing religious tradition, and the maple leaf embodies Canadian pride. Gold bands are woven through the "W" to illustrate the importance of the University's location on an international border, and also the journey a student takes to become an alumni member. The five areas of blue created in the negative space around the "W" represent each of the University's founding colleges: Assumption, Essex, Iona, Canterbury and Holy Redeemer. Blue and gold are proudly featured, harkening back to the traditional colours of the University of Windsor Lancers.

The modern elements of the logo include the outer shape of the shield, which has been matched to the curved silhouette

of the Lancer shield from the University's athletic teams. The clean, futuristic font is called "Din" and the grey colour, graphically speaking, is more approachable than solid black.

The University's Public Affairs and Communications office spent two years developing the new logo, conducting 21 focus groups with a total of 227 people representing various demographics such as current and future students, alumni, faculty and staff, community members and marketing professionals.

The total cost of the internal development was approximately \$14,000, the majority of which paid for focus group sessions of 30 senior high school students in Toronto, held in a professional research setting.

Campus Master Plan Peers into the Future

The release of a new master plan for the University of Windsor campus could not have come at a better time, says Rob Crawford, president of the undergraduate student government.

“In our 50th anniversary year, we are looking back and now looking forward to the next 50 years,” he says.

He points to the launch of a new logo, the opening of the Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation, plans for a downtown campus and an economic development cluster, and says the time is right for designs that make the UWindsor campus its own unique place.

The Board of Governors approved the Campus Master Plan at its June 18 meeting, establishing a vision for the next 50 years. Among the highlights for Crawford is the consolidation of residences south of Wyandotte Street, the creation of an amphitheatre in what is now the residence quad, and the extension of the campus to the banks of the Detroit River.

“Moving campus to the riverfront to give us an international presence would be really cool,” he says.

The plan—developed by +VG Architects in consultation with administration, faculty, students and community stakeholders—

heightens the sense of arrival on campus with impressive gateway signage and welcoming points of interest.

It envisions new pedestrian pathways enhanced with lighting, landscaping and signage that will lead to various hubs of activity for recreation, cultural displays, water features and gathering spaces with seating.

The plan does not project timelines, says UWindsor president Alan Wildeman, but is meant to work in conjunction with the

Campus Transformation Plan to determine how buildings connect, and what form the spaces between buildings will take.

“This document will act as a guide for future decisions regarding the aesthetics of new buildings, and it identifies key projects that could help unify the campus, and that could be undertaken as funding opportunities permit,” he says.

New Welcome Centre to be “Campus Front Door”

Work is expected to get underway shortly on the University of Windsor's new \$8-million Welcome Centre.

To be located near the northwest corner of Sunset Avenue and Wyandotte Street, the Welcome Centre will function as the front door to campus, becoming the official address and main identifier of the University.

The building will be the first capital project to specifically align with the design concepts in the Campus Master Plan, approved by the University's Board of Governors earlier this year.

The Welcome Centre will be approximately 20,000 square feet and will house the administrative offices of student admissions and recruitment, alumni affairs, annual giving and stewardship, the University campaign office, public affairs and communications, and a bookstore kiosk to sell branded merchandise.

The design/build contract was expected to be awarded early this fall, with construction beginning shortly thereafter. The projected completion is early 2015.

Ed Lumley Centre For Engineering Innovation Grand Opening

Engineering student Lotus Pupulin used a plasma torch to cut through an aluminum ribbon during the grand opening ceremonies for the Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation (CEI) on May 31.

"I am among the first cohort of students to walk the halls of the CEI and I am beaming with pride and excitement," the third-year student of civil engineering told officials representing every level of government, as well as industry leaders, educators and members of the general public during a reception to celebrate the opening of the \$112 million facility. Pupulin also served as a student consultant during the design phase of the CEI.

The facility represents the largest capital investment in the University's history. Construction of the building was supported by \$40 million in funding from the government of Ontario, with matching funds from the federal government, as well as \$5.3 million raised at a roast to pay tribute to the Honourable Ed Lumley, the University's chancellor for whom the building is named. A \$2.5-million gift from BMO Financial Group to fund the BMO Collaborative Learning Forum was the largest single gift made to the new facility.

"This is a major step for the University

of Windsor and for the Windsor-Essex region," said UWindsor president Alan Wildeman. "The Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation provides our students with an extraordinary facility within which to learn and to see engineering in action. It provides laboratories and research facilities where emerging priorities such as environmental sustainability, alternative energy, nanostructure, lighter materials, and more efficient manufacturing systems can be addressed."

Designed for the 21st century—with more classrooms and meeting rooms, expanded laboratory facilities, and the latest technological tools—the CEI greatly enhances the student experience at UWindsor and has transformed the Faculty of Engineering.

Its innovative Industrial Courtyard provides a fertile ground for joint industry/university research projects, creating a direct connection among education, research, and industrial innovation.

With more than 80 teaching and research laboratories, some of the new features have never been seen before in North America, including the iDesign studio and iFactory reconfigurable

manufacturing lab, and the BMO Collaborative Learning Forum, a 350-seat auditorium that can be easily adapted to facilitate interaction and small-group learning.

As well, the building features eight classrooms, more than a dozen student meeting rooms, and more than 300 computer workstations, giving students the collaborative meeting and study spaces they need to prepare for the challenges of a career in engineering.

The CEI is a "living building" that is wired for student learning, bringing engineering to life through real-time monitoring of the expansive green roof, cross-atrium bridges and HVAC performance.

Dr. Mehrdad Saif, dean of the Faculty of Engineering, says that, "If you believe as I do, that engineering education is the soil from which innovation grows, and if you believe that innovation is what we need for economic prosperity, then you would agree with me that the Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation is not only an investment in the University of Windsor, but it is also an investment in Windsor-Essex region, an investment in Ontario, and an investment in Canada."

UWindsor Partners With Maple Leaf Sports + Entertainment

The University of Windsor has entered into a strategic partnership with Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment (MLSE) to create new student internships, pursue research opportunities and establish promotions with the Toronto Maple Leafs, Toronto Raptors, Toronto FC and the Toronto Marlies.

The three-year agreement is the first of its kind for both organizations.

Jeff Deline, MLSE vice president of corporate partnerships, praised the company's newest partner.

"Our organization has a strong connection with UWindsor through the graduates we've hired and we are looking forward to working on research projects with their kinesiology and marketing students," he said. "We also chose UWindsor for this partnership because of their demonstrated dedication to the pursuit of excellence, both academically and through Lancer athletes."

Under the terms of the agreement, MLSE will provide internship opportunities to undergraduate and graduate students from UWindsor's business, human kinetics, computer science, statistics and

communications programs. This represents the largest number of internships for any university at MLSE.

Dave Bussière, UWindsor assistant vice-president, Admission and Records, and a professor of marketing, said the agreement addresses two issues for the University of Windsor.

"It gives us substantial promotional opportunities in the Greater Toronto Area," he said. "But more importantly, the focus on student employment and research within the sports industry is consistent with the University of Windsor Lancers' success at the provincial and national level."

Sunshine lit the stone façade of stately Dillon Hall on July 1, 1963. As its rays dappled the campus, a handful of students walked its quiet, tree-lined pathways.

In fact, the historic day that marked the birth of the University of Windsor had few witnesses, as the school offered no summer classes at that time.

Janis (Marcotte) Cascadden BA '66 remembers it well. She posed with a small group of students for a commemorative photo that day in the student centre.

“They gathered some of us who were lucky enough to work part-time on campus for a photo with a cake to celebrate,” says Cascadden, who was employed at both the University’s switchboard and the Registrar’s Office while at school.

That snapshot of seven snappily dressed men and women has become the face of the University of Windsor’s 50th anniversary festivities: bouffant and crewcut hair, plaid and pearls—a reflection of a simpler time when what was once a small, Catholic boys’ school stood on the cusp of great change.

On December 19, 1962, the University of Windsor was incorporated by the Ontario Legislature, accepting Assumption University in Federation. Six months later, as June 1963 drew to a close, campus posters announced the coming name change to complete the official transformation into a non-denominational public institution.

“I remember the posters said something like, we were changing the name but the school would remain the same,” says Cascadden. Despite the low-key July 1 ceremony though, she remembers a sense that “the University was going to really explode with growth.”

The campus of Cascadden’s day was home to Dillon, Memorial and St. Denis Halls, where students dressed in sport coats and dresses to cheer on the basketball team. Professors chatted with students over coffee at the University Centre.

A Bachelor of Arts student majoring in home economics and English, Cascadden

paid \$465 for one year’s tuition. She still recalls her awe at the amphitheatre-style classroom in the brand-new Essex Hall building where first-year students sat through English and psychology lectures. “Those classrooms could fit 100 people. We’d never been in a class that could hold more than 30.”

In 1963, the campus population barely comprised a thousand students. “I think I knew everyone,” says the alumna. “When there was a dance or a game, all the students would go. Life on campus was a lot of fun.”

As a public institution and a regional university, however, the new University of Windsor made a postsecondary education more accessible, spurring a significant

enrolment spike. From 1967-77 alone, its population ballooned from approximately 1,500 to 8,000 full-time students. Today, more than 16,500 students from 90 countries around the world call the campus their home.

The Reverend Eugene Lebel, the first president and vice-chancellor of the University of Windsor, and Father Norbert Ruth, its first dean of Arts and Science, stood as the architects of the institutional transformation. Following in their place, a succession of dedicated leaders steered the University through periods of growth and challenge.

As the decades progressed, the academic programs of the small, liberal

arts college evolved, becoming more comprehensive and reflective of the times. Today, more than 140 undergraduate and graduate programs are offered across nine faculties.

The campus infrastructure grew in response to the increased demands placed on it. Additions included the Biology Building, Leddy Library, the Faculty of Law Building, the Odette Building, the CAW Student Centre, and student residences, among others.

Dillon Hall remains a graceful architectural testament to the early days of the institution, while the state-of-the-art, \$112-million Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation (CEI) is the newest campus jewel.

Even as the community gathered at the CEI's grand opening this past spring (see story page 12), the University had its sights firmly set on the future, with plans underway for a downtown campus, slated to open in 2015.

The growth and stature of a University are not only measured in new facilities erected, but in the alumni it produces. This October, the University of Windsor will also celebrate its 100th convocation ceremony during which its 115,000th graduate will grace the stage.

As part of that ever-growing alumni family, Janis Cascadden plans to return to the campus when the events of that sunny July afternoon are marked with a celebratory weekend, Sept. 19-22.

The historic day still stands out clearly in her memory. She and other students assembled around an artificial cake with a large candle like tube that was actually lit. Now living in London, Ont., she recently saw the photo on the University's Facebook page. "One day I thought, I'm going to see



what the University of Windsor page is like and son of a gun—there was my picture!"

This past March, the University recreated the photo (page 16) with present-day students to raise awareness of the 50th celebration. Nadia Esmaeilpour, one of the students in the new picture, compared the women in the original photo to movie stars.

"That's a riot," chuckles Cascadden. "That was just the way we dressed back in the 1960s for school. Girls in heels, guys in leather shoes. What was a running shoe?"

The alumna had a chance to reacquire herself with the campus when she visited earlier this year. "We drove up Sunset Avenue—I barely recognized it. I remember when you could see Dillon Hall from there."

How will the University's campus look 50 years from now? It's already in the planning stages. Just this past June, the University's Board of Governors approved a Campus Master Plan, establishing a vision for the next 50 years (see story page 11).

"An anniversary is a time when promises made long ago are remade," says Alan Wildeman, University president and vice-chancellor. "The University of Windsor's 50th Anniversary is a time when all of us can remind ourselves of the promise that our beginnings were founded on - the vow to put students first and to provide the best education experience we can, and to mobilize knowledge and creativity in the service of our community and the world. Our first 50 years have been a fulfilment of that commitment, a fulfilment made possible by the dedication of faculty, staff, students, alumni, friends and volunteers. Together, after 50 years, we are renewing that promise." **V**

Dr. J. Francis Leddy became president of the University of Windsor, and presided over a period of explosive growth of the university. From 1967-77, UWindsor grew from approximately 1,500 to 8,000 full-time students.

ED LUMLEY

BComm '61



The Honourable Ed Lumley, namesake of the Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation, was first appointed as University of Windsor chancellor in 2006, and was named to a third term in 2012.

Born and raised in Windsor, he graduated in 1961 from Assumption University, predecessor of the University of Windsor. A successful entrepreneur, he had a distinguished record of achievement as Mayor

of Cornwall, Ont., and 10 years as a Member of Parliament. As a Minister of the Crown, his portfolios included Industry, International Trade, and Science & Technology. During that time, he also held responsibility for such Crown Corporations as the CBC, the Canada Development Investment Corp. and the Export Development Corporation.

Lumley, Vice Chair of BMO Nesbitt Burns for more than 25 years, served on the board of directors of many domestic and international companies including Air Canada, Bell Canada Enterprises, Canadian National Railway, and Magna International.

His colleagues in the all-party Canadian Association of Former Parliamentarians selected Lumley to be the second recipient of their Lifetime Achievement Award.

MICHAEL BELL

BA '66, MA '67



Michael Bell BA '66, MA '67 is the Paul Martin Senior Scholar in International Diplomacy in the Political Science Program at the University of Windsor.

He is part of the Jerusalem Old City Initiative team, working with Israeli, Palestinian, American and British civil society partners to explore policy options and advocacy relating to Old City governance, which could be utilized in the

negotiation of a peace treaty between the Israelis and Palestinians.

Bell's outstanding diplomatic career included stints as Canadian Ambassador to Israel, Jordan and Egypt. He was named Fellow at the Weatherhead Centre for International Affairs at Harvard University and served as the Senior Scholar on diplomacy at the University of Toronto's Munk Centre for International Studies.

The alumnus is also a 2004 the recipient of the University of Windsor's Alumni Association Alumni Award of Merit.

1980s/90s

Enrolment growth continued through the 1980s and early 1990s, particularly under the leadership of President Ron Ianni. Among the new buildings erected were the Odette Business Building and the CAW Student Centre.

2008

Among the first official duties of current President Alan Wildeman, who took office in July 2008, was the formal opening of the Medical Education Building.

May 2011

In May 2011, the University announced its plans to expand the campus into Windsor's downtown core as the new home for the School for Arts and Creative Innovation, the School of Social Work and the Centre for Executive and Professional Education.

2003

Enrolment reached record heights of more than 16,000 full- and part-time students in the fall of 2003 with the elimination of OAC year. In response, the University invested more than \$50 million in the new Alumni Hall student residence, the Anthony P. Toldo Health Education Centre, the Jackman Dramatic Art Centre, and classroom and lab upgrades.

June 2011

In June 2011, the University celebrated its 100,000 graduate at the Spring Convocation ceremony.

DR. DOUGLAS STOCCO

BSc '67, MSc '69, LLD '13



Dr. Douglas Stocco is executive vice president for research and dean of the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center in Lubbock, Texas.

He is known nationally and internationally as a prominent scientist, primarily for his discovery of Steroidogenic Acute Regulatory protein (StAR). Since 1995, approximately 250 papers have been

written in regards to his research.

Stocco's work is supported by the National Institutes of Health. He holds a US patent for Compositions and Methods for Regulation of Steroidogenesis and is a member of six professional societies.

The researcher serves on the editorial boards of *Molecular and Cellular Endocrinology*, *Endocrine*, and *The Journal of Endocrinology*. More than 200 peer-reviewed original scientific articles, book chapters and review articles document Stocco's work.

He has garnered wide recognition, including the Research Award by the Society for the Study of Reproduction; the Achievement Rewards for College Scientists Distinguished Scientist Award; and the Transatlantic Medal Award by the British Endocrine Society, among many others.

Stocco received a Raine Distinguished Professorship at the University of Western Australia and is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

CYNTHIA TRUDELL

PhD '78, LLD '99



Cynthia Trudell is chief human resources officer and executive vice president of Human Resources at Pepsico Inc., a position she has held since 2011.

Trudell earned a doctorate in physical chemistry from the University of Windsor in 1978. She began her career in 1979 with the Ford Motor Co. in Windsor, Ont., as a chemical process engineer. In 1981, she joined GM as a senior engineering

supervisor and later became superintendent of manufacturing.

In 1987, she was appointed manufacturing engineering manager at the Willow Run Transmission complex in Ypsilanti, Michigan. In 1992, she was promoted to site manager, engine and foundry operations in St. Catharines, Ont. Following this assignment, in 1995, Trudell was named plant manager of the Wilmington Assembly Center in Wilmington, Delaware.

From 1999 to 2001, Trudell served as General Motors' vice president and also served as chair and president of Saturn Corporation, a wholly owned subsidiary of GM.

She was vice president of Brunswick Corporation and divisional president of Sea Ray Boats from 2001 to 2006. In this role, she expanded the company's reach in the global marketplace and brought new innovations to the company's manufacturing processes and technology.

Trudell joined Pepsico in 2007.

Her significant career achievements were recognized with the Alumni Association's highest honour, the Award of Merit, in 2006.

Trudell will be on campus to participate in the Odette Leadership Symposium in January 2014.

2012

In fall 2012, the \$112-million, 300,000-square foot Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation became the new home for the Faculty of Engineering.

October 2013

The University's new parking structure at the corner of Wyandotte and Sunset will open in fall of 2013.

The parking structure consists of seven levels to accommodate up to 1,000 cars.

June 2013

In June 2013, the University's Board of Governors approved a Campus Master Plan that establishes a vision for the next 50 years, with an attractive design that enriches both the student and the community experience, and positions the university to be more competitive.

October 2013

ANNA MARIA TREMONTI

BA '78, LLD '01



Anna Maria Tremonti, one of the most trusted voices in Canadian journalism for three decades, now digs behind the headlines for listeners across Canada weekday mornings as host of CBC radio's *The Current*.

Between 1991 and 2000, Tremonti filed reports for CBC Television from a rotating cast of international home bases: Berlin, London, Jerusalem, and Washington. She has covered conflict and crisis in more than 30 countries, providing the CBC with eyewitness accounts of the war in Bosnia, the Arab-Israeli conflict and the break-up of the Soviet Union.

When she began her career at a small radio station in 1978, she was the first woman hired to go on the air. "In my career, I've seen women move into all levels of newsgathering," says Tremonti. "Now, our bosses send reporters on any story regardless of gender."

Tremonti has won two Gemini awards and an outstanding achievement award from Toronto Women in Film and Television. A graduate of UWindsor's Communications Studies program, she was given an honorary doctorate in 2001.

SERGIO MARCHIONNE

BComm '79, LLD '05



Sergio Marchionne, chairman and CEO of Chrysler Group LLC, and CEO, Fiat S.p.A., is an auto industry legend, having brought both companies back from the brink of bankruptcy to profitability.

Marchionne is known for his affinity for sweaters, driving, and emailing via several cell phones at one time. He spends much of his time on airplanes journeying between the home bases of his companies in Detroit, Mich., and Turin, Italy.

Although a native son of that Mediterranean country, Marchionne was raised in Canada, and studied business at the University of Windsor. His career trajectory took him from accountant and tax specialist for Deloitte Touche in

Canada through senior roles in finance at a series of corporations and, ultimately, to the helm of Fiat S.p.A. in 2004.

He has served as chair of the European Automobile Manufacturers Association, Swiss-based SGS and the Italian Branch of the Council for the United States and Italy. Marchionne is a member of the Peterson Institute for International Economics.

In accepting an honorary degree from the University in 2005, the graduate said that he was proud to be back at, "this illustrious university, respected in Canada and internationally." Marchionne's continued interest in UWindsor contributed to the 2011 agreement between the Politecnico di Torino (Italy) and UWindsor that created a co-operative international engineering master's program working on cutting-edge research and development projects with Chrysler and Fiat.

Marchionne was the 2013 recipient of the Award for Excellence in Global Business from the Order of the Sons of Italy in America.

LINDA STAUDT

BHK '81, BEd '85, MEd '95

Linda Staudt first attracted attention as an outstanding distance runner but eventually made her name as stellar teacher and school administrator.

The London District Catholic school board recently named Staudt as its new director of education. Previously, she spent 25 years with the Windsor-Essex District Catholic school board as a teacher, track coach, principal and superintendent. Since 2009, she worked in Toronto with the Education Ministry to boost high school grad rates, where she oversaw the department's Student Success/Learning to 18 program. The initiative helps Ontario students who are struggling to succeed academically and reaches out to those who have dropped out of school to encourage them to graduate. The program also allows students to focus their studies on their own areas of interest through a specialist major.

"I've always had a love of learning," Staudt told the *London Free Press* when her new appointment was announced. "It's always fun to be around young people. The students are always the same age. They keep us young and they inspire and motivate us."

At the University of Windsor, Staudt twice won the "Banner Shield" as the Female-Athlete-of-the-Year, in 1978 and 1980.

As a runner, 1981 was her most impressive year, during which she won the Tokyo marathon, the Montreal International Marathon and was selected as the Canadian Runner-of-the-Year by *Canadian Runner Magazine*. She competed for a spot on Canada's 1984 Olympic team but was sidelined by an injury.

PAULAH DAUNS

BA '81, LLB '82



Paulah Dauns is a woman who lives out the Law School's theme of Access to Justice with every decision she makes.

Dauns, called to the bar in both Ontario and British Columbia, is an adjudicator for the Indian Residential Schools Secretariat, an independent tribunal that provides impartial claims adjudication for those who have suffered sexual and physical abuse at federally administered Indian residential schools.

She is the former assistant deputy chairperson of the Immigration and Refugee Board, and a former Refugee law judge. Dauns has also served two terms on the University of

Windsor's Alumni board of directors, and is an engaged contributor to the Faculty of Law.

Dauns was a refugee law judge, hearing more than 100 cases. She also wrote several leading decisions including international drug and people trafficking cases. The judgment she wrote on medical marijuana regarding a US refugee claimant was upheld by the Federal Court of Canada.

Dauns was also the Vancouver Regional Director of the Legal Services Society, which provides free legal assistance to eligible, low income citizens for criminal, family, immigration and civil matters through clinics and members of the Bar.

DR. QIAN TANG

MHK '82, PhD '87



Dr. Qian Tang is the assistant director-general for education for UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization). Under his tenure, Education for All is a key goal of UNESCO's Education Sector.

Born in Beijing, China, Tang earned his bachelor's degree in education from Shanxi University, China in 1976, followed by a Master of Human Kinetics in 1982 and PhD in Biological Sciences in 1987 from the University of Windsor.

Tang joined UNESCO as senior program specialist in the section for Technical and Vocational Education in 1993. He became chief of the Section in 1996. In this position, he assumed the overall co-ordination of UNESCO's International Project of Technical and Vocational Education and organization of the Second International Congress on Technical and Vocational Education.

Tang served as director of the Executive Office for the Education Sector from 2001 to 2005. He then became deputy assistant director-general for education, responsible for overall co-ordination of the Education Sector's strategic planning, program implementation, finance and budgeting as well as human resource management.

Tang was appointed assistant director-general for education in April 2010. Since then, he has led the efforts to revitalize the sector to raise the visibility of education on the international development agenda and provide concrete assistance to UNESCO's member states.

MARY JO HADDAD

BScN '84, LLD '05



Mary Jo Haddad is president and CEO of The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto, Canada's most research-intensive hospital and the largest centre dedicated

to improving children's health in the country.

For Haddad, who earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing in 1984, the development of her leadership potential was a valuable outcome of her education at UWindsor. Already a full-time nurse when she enrolled, Haddad says that she wanted to broaden her understanding of the health care system, and learn more about the theory behind the practice and leadership.

"The University of Windsor allowed me to build on my strengths," says Haddad. "As a mature student, I was encouraged to challenge my profs, which I did, because I wanted that dialogue."

Upon graduation, Haddad returned to The Hospital for Sick Children where she had worked prior to enrolling at UWindsor, and her private practice as a nurse practitioner focused on newborns at risk. She eventually moved on to become the NICU manager and to her current role, from which she is retiring at the end of this year.

"The rewards of my education are hard to put into words. I get to work with a calibre of people in my field that you can't find anywhere else in Canada. I've had opportunities for innovation and leadership. It's been a tremendous foundation for my success."

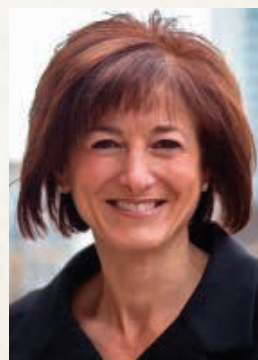

Whittle joined the Living Sky School Division in 2010.

Among her awards, the Ontario Teachers Insurance Plan and the Ontario Teachers' Federation honoured Whittle as the top secondary school teacher in Ontario in 2004.

In 2007, Whittle received a University of Windsor Alumni Association Odyssey Award as a young alumna who has distinguished herself.

LLB '94



Abony is CEO and chairman of Mood Media, a company valued at \$1.3 billion.

In January 2013, he was featured on the Emmy Award-winning CBS series

"Undercover Boss" in which the disguised executive worked hand-in-hand with employees who provide the company's front-line services.

The UWindsor grad's phenomenally successful company provides music, digital signage, messaging, social/mobile applications, location-based services and scent marketing to retail stores, hotels, restaurants and businesses such as McDonald's, Gucci, H&M, Abercrombie & Fitch, Nike, Hilton Hotel and AT&T. Serving more than 560,000 commercial locations in 55 countries, Mood's products reach more than 150 million people every day. In 2011, *PROFIT* magazine named it Canada's fastest-growing company.

With his company's international reach, Abony says his decision to pursue the combined US and Canada law degree program at UWindsor has paid off.

"My legal education in Windsor was fundamental in teaching me how to think about problems, how to challenge traditional ideas and how to subject thoughts to rigorous scrutiny."

Abony co-founded online skills game site FUN Technologies in 2001 and attracted more than 25 million registered users. In 2004, he became the youngest CEO of a listed company on the Toronto Stock Exchange, and in 2006 the *Globe and Mail* named the dynamic entrepreneur to its Top 40 under 40 list. In 2005, Abony sold his 51 percent controlling interest to Liberty Media, for \$196 million.

BEVERLEY JACOBS

LLB '94



Beverley Jacobs is making a difference for Aboriginal women in Canada.

Jacobs is a lawyer and owner at Bear Clan Consulting and a Kanienkehaka (Mohawk) community representative from the Six Nations of the Grand River Territory, Bear Clan.

She is past president of the Native Women's Association of Canada (NWAC). As NWAC president from 2004-09, Jacobs brought public attention to the fact that some 500 Aboriginal women had been found murdered or gone missing in Canada over a 20-year period. She personally gathered information by meeting

with families and pushed governments to take action to investigate and uncover why.

Under her, NWAC also worked to address other inequalities affecting Aboriginal women in Canada, and to revitalize traditional values that promote equality.

As a law student in Windsor 20 years ago, she persevered despite being a single mother and the only Aboriginal student in her class. The support of professors, the dean and associate dean were the bulwark she says that she used against the tide of despair. "I think that's what saved me—those relationships," she says.

ANDREA ROWE-PARRAGA

BASc '97, MASc '00

In her role as project manager for Ottawa Community Housing (OCH), Andrea Rowe-Parraga is responsible for helping to identify and solve building problems for the agency's 15,000 units—the second-largest housing provider in Canada.

The alumna says her role is to look at the condition of all of the corporation's building and help determine if they need to be sold, demolished, retrofitted or fixed. Her mechanical engineering experience is in the fields of building science, forensic engineering and automotive engineering where she has conducted research, testing analysis, problem solving and report writing.

Rowe-Parraga, a 2010 recipient of the UWindsor Alumni Association Odyssey Award, says that the knowledge she gained at UWindsor "provided me with the confidence to take on any project, knowing that my foundation in engineering would provide the scientific background required to examine, diagnose and resolve any problem."

After graduation, Rowe-Parraga joined the Ford Quality Department as a graduate co-op student and pursued her Master of Applied Science in NVH powertrain research at UWindsor. In 2000, she became the first student to graduate from the NVH Powertrain Research & Development Group. She joined OCH in 2010 and is currently involved with a project related to the restructuring of the entire corporation.

PADRUIG MACINTOSH

BASc '01



You can't blame Capt. Padruig MacIntosh if his head is in the clouds. As a member of Canada's 431 Air Demonstration Squadron (Snowbirds), that's where

you'll frequently find him.

The Windsor native knew from a young age that he wanted to be a pilot like his mother. He attended air shows throughout the region and learned all he could about airplanes.

MacIntosh joined the Canadian Forces a year after earning his engineering degree. In 2005, he earned Canadian Forces pilot wings after he completed hundreds of hours of in-air training, and was selected to fly jets. He then served as a Canadian Forces flying instructor.

In February 2010, after a month of the most mentally demanding tryouts MacIntosh says that he had ever experienced, he became one of the Snowbirds' four newest members.

The alumnus credits his university education as the bridge to realizing his aspirations. "Without the degree I earned, I never would have become a product design engineer and later a pilot for the Canadian Forces. I never would have earned Canada's trust in being one of its ambassadors as a member of the Canadian Forces Snowbirds."

Communication Studies graduate Jeff May is president and CEO of the Boiling Point Wheelchair Track Classic—a high-performance, international track meet for athletes with disabilities.

Co-founded and incorporated by May, this non-profit organization played host in its first year to the International Paralympics Committee's wheelchair 1500-metre Selection Trials for the IAAF World Athletic Championships in Japan.

A para-athlete himself, May won 24 Ontario titles and captured his first national title at the Canadian Track & Field Championships. He has won numerous awards including the Outstanding Achievement Award from the Wallaceburg Sports Hall of Fame, and the Male Athlete of the Year Award from the Ontario Amputee Les Autres Sports Association.

He is president of the Windsor Bulldogs Disabled Sports Club—one of the longest running clubs in Ontario.

A motivational speaker, he shares his personal story with his audiences, with the objective of empowering them to embrace and appreciate their own and very unique abilities.

May was a 2009 recipient of the University of Windsor Alumni Association Odyssey Award.

ARIC RANKIN

BScN '05, CNP '12



Aric Rankin says that his passion is to provide health care to those who need it most. After graduation, he volunteered as a registered nurse providing HIV/AIDS care at the Tsepong Place of Hope clinic in the Kingdom of Lesotho. He was part of the first medical relief teams to respond to the devastating 2010 earthquake in Haiti.

Such experiences convinced Rankin that he wanted to be a primary care provider. He returned to UWindsor as a part-time student in its Primary Care Nurse Practitioner program, graduating in 2012.

Rankin has worked in the emergency departments at Children's Hospital at London Health Sciences Centre and McMaster Children's Hospital, and as a community health nurse in fly-in northern Ontario communities. He is a nursing ambassador for the Ontario Nursing Secretariat and a part-time clinical instructor for the nursing school at the University of Western Ontario. Diagnosed with Crohn's as a teen, he is a volunteer counsellor for the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of Canada.

Rankin has won the Dr. Helen Mussallem Fellowship, the Lauren Packer Memorial Award for Child and Family Centered Care and the International Nurses Interest Group, RNO Bursary. He is 2010 Alumni Association Odyssey Award winner.

CHRISTINE DALY

BSc '03, MSc '07



Christine Daly is making her mark in the oil sands of Alberta by turning what was once a desolate pond full of toxic effluent back into natural green space and setting the industry

standard for wetlands reclamation projects there.

"It wasn't beautiful before, but it's beautiful now," the environmental sciences graduate says of the tailings pond in Fort McMurray, Alta., she helped transform into a 220-hectare watershed that includes a growing forest, streams and a small wetland.

Daly is a research co-ordinator in Suncor's reclamation department. She was hired immediately after graduation to guide the design of diverse and functional wetlands in the post-mined landscape. The Wapisiw wetland was created on the historic, first-ever reclaimed oil sands tailings pond—a project her former academic supervisor, Dr. Jan Ciborowski, says will be a "poster child for reclamation activities in the area." Suncor is one of seven industry partners in a UWindsor-led project that examined different strategies for turning tailings ponds back into wetlands.

A self-described environmentalist, Daly says the experience gave her fresh perspective on the importance of working with industry rather than against it in order to solve critical issues that involve sustainability. "I thought it might be a challenge, being an environmentalist working for a large oil company, but I've been pleasantly surprised by how supportive they've been," she says. "It felt really good to be a part of this."

Her reclamation team was awarded the company's highest honour, the President's Operational Excellence Award.

Daly is a 2011 Alumni Association Odyssey Award recipient.

JULIE RUEL

BA '04, '05

Women's Studies graduate Julie Ruel is a reference and research librarian at the Bank of Canada in Ottawa.

She says that her Women's Studies courses had "a huge impact on my career choices and aspirations."

After her graduation from the University of Windsor, Ruel continued studies in English Literature in Edmonton where she found her passion for librarianship and pursued her Master's of Library and Information Science.

"I was one of the co-chairs of the student group Future Librarians for Intellectual Freedom," Ruel says. "I participated and planned Freedom to Read Week, and helped plan a project to provide library services, including book clubs, to women in the Edmonton Institution for Women."

Ruel was awarded an internship at the Smithsonian's Archive Center at the American History Museum in Washington and worked there on various projects including reference and research, organizing a small collection and digitizing various collections.

She then obtained a position at the Bank of Canada as a reference and research librarian in Ottawa, Ont. where she continues to work with marginalized communities as a public librarian.

An entrepreneur, social advocate, youth leader and analyst—Prerna Chandak has worn many hats in her life and has learned a thing or two about what it takes to overcome the hurdles young go-getters face.

In 2008, Chandak was honoured as one of *Chatelaine Magazine's* 80 Amazing Women to Watch in Canada, and is also a past recipient of Youth in Motion's National Top 20 Under 20 award.

As an institutional analyst with the Canadian Institutional Portfolio Management Team at Phillips, Hager & North Investment Management/RBC Global Asset Management, Chandak manages close to \$2 billion

in assets under management for defined contribution pension clients and corporations across Canada.

After seeing the struggles of young entrepreneurs around her as well as her own experiences in the start-up world, in early 2007 Chandak founded Lemonade Ventures, an early-stage capital and business consulting firm, to increase the flow of capital and other essential business resources to innovative ventures launched by young Canadian entrepreneurs.

In early 2012, Chandak founded Stilettos & Code, a non-profit group working to enhance an environment that encourages the promotion, growth and success of women in tech startups and to promote more funding to women-led tech startups in Toronto, Montreal and New York.

Chandak is a 2009 Alumni Association Odyssey Award recipient.

An Investment in our Future

A scholarship supported by alumni through the Annual Giving Program helped to lift a weight off her shoulders, says Krishna Valera, a fourth-year civil engineering student.

Born in India and raised in New Zealand, she says that, as an international student, she has many costs. “When I received my scholarship cheque, I went right out and paid for my textbooks,” she says. “That saved me money I could use to pay my other bills.”

Now a telephone canvasser for the fundraising campaign, Valera says she appreciates the contributions of donors. “The majority of people you call make a pledge,” she says. “They went through the same process as you and so they know how hard it is for some students.”

Since 1985, the program and its attendant phonathon have provided an opportunity for alumni, parents and friends to help support student achievement at the University of Windsor.

Patti Lauzon, director of alumni and donor communications, says that having students reach out is a key to the program’s success. “For our graduates to get a call from a student reflects the reason we are all here,” says Lauzon. “The student contact helps us to build the relationship we have with alumni and donors, making them feel a part of the University of Windsor family.”

It’s a point seconded by alumni affairs director Susan Lester. “Our phonathon is about so much more than just raising money,” she says. “It gives the student callers a chance to be mentored by these alumni. I hear so many stories about how they were inspired by the success stories they hear from our graduates—and by their continuing willingness to support the school.”

Lester says those connections make a difference: “You can see it in the fact that the students who have had a chance to be involved in our outreach are the first ones to turn around and give back following their own graduation.”

Janesa Charles, a master of management student who has worked as a phonathon canvasser, recalls a conversation that she had with an alumnus who confided that he was ill. “This man had cancer, and he still made time to talk with me and gave \$100,” says Charles. “The selflessness he had displayed inspired me. I know I will give when my turn comes.”

Development officer Mona Dosen, who co-ordinates the phonathon, says this fall’s campaign runs from September through November with a goal of raising \$500,000. Even with the ambitious target, she says, the focus isn’t on money.

“The most fascinating thing about the phonathon are the connections that form between current students and past students to benefit future students,” Dosen says. “My hope is that, when the phone rings and they see it’s from us, they have a smile on their faces to greet the students. I guarantee they won’t be disappointed with the conversations they have.” **V**

Basketball all-stars Jessica Clemençon and Miah-Marie Langlois and multiple record-holder Jordan Brescacin headlined the Windsor Lancers' annual Evening of Excellence this year.

Langlois, who was named the Canadian Interuniversity Sport (CIS) defensive player of the year for the second consecutive season, earned her second-straight Banner Shield. She led the CIS with a 2.7 assist to turnover ratio, was second in the nation with 6.3 assists per game, and third in total steals with 67.

She shared it with teammate and all-Canadian Clemençon, who was second in Ontario University Athletics (OUA) and eighth in CIS scoring with an average of 19.6 points per game.

The golden pair led the Lancers women's basketball team to a perfect season and its third-straight national championship this past year. The Lancers went 21-0 in regular season play and 6-0 in the playoffs.

Brescacin earned the Olympic Shield as a wide receiver who re-wrote the OUA record books. The first-team All-Canadian tallied 68 catches this season and finished his career with 192 career catches—both conference records. He is the all-time Lancer record holder in single-season receiving yards (979) and touchdown receptions (27).

The DeMarco Awards, presented annually to the top female and male students who best combine academic achievement with athletic prowess, went to OUA Individual Golf Champion Meaghan Pototschnik and men's soccer co-captain Massimo Megna.

The inaugural Captain's Trophy, awarded to a male and female captain who

demonstrate outstanding leadership both on and off the field while also making a significant contribution to the overall success of their team, went to hockey players Alyssa Baldin and Brett Vandehogan.

The Windsor Lancer Gino Fracas Coach of the Year Award was presented to women's basketball coach Chantal Vallée—the first coach in OUA women's basketball history to guide her team to a perfect record since the conference moved to a 22-game schedule.

The female rookie of the year award went to women's volleyball athlete Shannon Dean. The male rookie honours were awarded to men's soccer player

Cristian Mayorga.

The Super Sophomore awards were presented to women's soccer standout Alyshia Phillips and to OUA men's hockey all-star Spencer Pommells, who ranked sixth in the nation with 38 points.

"A" Awards, marking major contributions to Lancer Athletics, went to the men's and women's hockey team's support staff, including Jim Snively, Remo Mastrodicasa, John Hunter and Debi Curran, and also to supporters Vince Bassman BComm '70, and Pat Bassman BA '69.

PUPATELLO NAMED 50TH ANNIVERSARY RECIPIENT OF ALUMNI'S HIGHEST HONOUR

Sandra Pupatello BA '86, LLD '12, a longtime advocate for the University of Windsor, will receive the **Alumni Award of Merit** at the Alumni Association's Annual General Meeting and Awards Presentations this November 21st.

Named CEO of the WindsorEssex Development Corporation in May, Pupatello continues to serve as director, Business Development and Global Markets for PricewaterhouseCoopers Canada. She was MPP, Windsor West from 1995-2011 and Minister of Community & Social Services from 2003-05. During this time she created the Jobs Now program to help welfare recipients enter the workforce, and the Passport Program to support people with developmental disabilities. She was Minister of Education in 2005 and implemented a

small class-size policy, the first of its kind in North America.

Pupatello was Minister of Economic Development & Trade from 2006-11 and among other contributions, created the Open For Business Secretariat to review, improve and standardize government services to best support economic development. She introduced Ontario's class-leading electric vehicle initiatives and programs; established the Ontario-Quebec Trade and Economic Agreement to increase investment and trade between the provinces; signed trade and investment co-operation agreements in such global markets as China, Mexico and the European Union; initiated and hosted the province's first-ever global industrial Aerospace show in 2010; and established a rare agreement to further

collaboration and investment and operations in Ontario with General Electric, Siemens and Cisco.

Among other honours, Pupatello has received the CAMM and CTMA Awards; the Canadian Manufacturers & Exporters Advocacy and Leadership Award; The Athena Award for Inspiring Women in Business Leadership; Windsor Woman of the Year; Honorary Rotary Club of Windsor Member, and Paul Harris Fellow; University of Windsor's Charles Clark Award for University and Community Service; and Italian of the Year for Windsor-Essex County.

In May 2012, Pupatello chaired a roast of University Chancellor Ed Lumley that helped to raise \$5.3 million for the Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation.

FOUR SET FOR INDUCTION TO ALUMNI SPORTS HALL OF FAME

This fall, former Lancer athletes Andy Auch, Valérie Hamel, Gerald Hlady and Ed Petryshyn will be inducted in the Alumni Sports Hall of Fame.



Andy Auch BSc '69, BEd '74, MEd '77 was a leader on the basketball court. His teams won two OQAA Championships

(1966-67, 1968-69) and two national titles (1966-67, 1968-69). He was a first team OQAA all-star in 1969 and won the DeMarco Award as the top male student-athlete.



Valérie Hamel BA '04 was the first true women's hockey superstar at UWindsor. She was a three-time OUA all-star and

captured the Banner Shield twice as the University of Windsor's Female Athlete of

the Year. She is a three-time CIS Academic All-Canadian and won the prestigious DeMarco Award in 2001-02 as the top female student-athlete.



A lineman for the Lancer football team, **Gerald Hlady** BHK '91, BEd '92 was an all-star athlete and student. He was a

three-time OUAA all-star, CIAU Academic All-Canadian, and DeMarco Award recipient. Hlady was a national finalist for the Russ Jackson Award that recognizes outstanding achievement in athletics, academics and community service. Following graduation, the Ottawa Roughriders drafted him in the fourth round of the CFL draft.



Ed Petryshyn BA '64 played for two CIAU championship basketball teams (1962-63, 1963-64). He led the

team in rebounding in 1963-64. Petryshyn went on to play baseball with the Baltimore Orioles minor league club.

The induction ceremonies will include the presentation of the Sport Achievement Awards to Jack Schroeder BA '65, BPE '68, MEd '91, and Phil Haddad BA '66. The Team Achievement Award will recognize the 1967-68 and 1969-70 women's basketball teams and the 1967-68 and 1968-69 women's swimming teams.

ALUMNI HONOUR THREE FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

The Alumni Association honoured three stellar professors at Spring Convocation, held this past June, with the Alumni Award for Distinguished Contributions to University Teaching.

Dr. Philip Dutton, former head of the Chemistry and Biochemistry Department, received letters of support for his nomination from current and former students that praised his passion and commitment.

“Dr. Dutton’s enthusiasm helped me rise above my obstacles and strive for excellence,” wrote Sara Ghoneim. “He always challenged his students and engaged us in his lectures in ways that made the course material unforgettable.” Colleagues touted his versatility—he teaches courses in a variety of subjects, including large, introductory classes, and helped to develop a redesigned undergraduate curriculum.

Dutton says that, “There is nothing more satisfying than watching students move through the training of their undergraduate and graduate careers and go on to be successful contributors to society.”

Knowing and trusting the strengths of each teacher candidate in her classes is what drives education professor **Kara Smith**.

In nominating Dr. Smith, Acting Associate Dean Geri Salintri said she most

appreciates Smith’s creative approach to assessment. “She varies her approach with each course and constantly reflects on the value of the assessment to the learning in the classroom. Her style is dynamic and fluid and her belief in students’ talents directs their success.”

Smith, editor of *Teaching, Learning, Assessing: A Guide for Effective Teaching at College and University*, says that she believes in helping her students enter their careers with a thirst for continued discovery.

Two words resurface in the letters of support for English professor **Dale Jacobs**: innovation and generosity. Dr. Jacobs is director of the department’s composition program, the only one of its kind in the country. Its graduates praise him for going “above and beyond”.

Graduate Hollie Adams wrote that when she and two classmates completed the pedagogy seminar, they wanted to continue their studies. “While he was already teaching a full course-load, Dr. Jacobs agreed to develop and supervise a directed study, tailored specifically to our

interests,” she said. “Despite the amount of work involved, he was actually eager to take on this additional responsibility.”

Josh Mehler recalls Jacobs’ willingness to learn with his graduate students. “There is no doubt that Dr. Jacobs cares deeply and genuinely about his students and their success, and that genuine connection is reflected in every aspect of his academic life.”

Established in 1987, the alumni teaching award recognizes excellence in all areas of teaching, including classroom presentation, curriculum development, versatility, teaching methods, and student support.

Assumption at the Core

Congratulating the University of Windsor at 50!

When the University of Windsor's President and Vice Chancellor, Dr. Alan Wildeman unveiled the new anniversary logo, he pointed out that the logo's shield represents a stylized version of UWindsor's coat of arms from 1963, which uses symbols originally taken from its predecessor Assumption College, founded in 1857. Dr. Wildeman explained that the fleur-de-lis is symbolic of the French-Canadian heritage of Windsor-Essex as well as the Basilian order. The lily is a heraldic icon representing religious tradition, and the maple leaf embodies Canadian pride. The five areas of blue created in the negative space around the "W" represent each of the University's founding colleges; Assumption, Essex, Iona, Canterbury and Holy Redeemer. I have never seen a logo so reflective and evocative as this one is. Nor have I seen one that summarizes beautifully the roots of this great university.

The Catholic Church founded the first universities in the West and possesses a venerable and dynamic tradition of scholarship. Catholic universities from their earliest moments have taught both important non-Catholic thinkers and representatives from its own tradition of learning, now nearly 2,000 years old. Assumption University is the oldest Catholic university in English Canada. It is at the origin, the core and the heart of the University of Windsor. We cannot forget the rich history of Assumption University.

In 1784 the Jesuits expanded the mission they had founded in Detroit in 1728 to include the south shore of the Detroit River. The Hurons gave the Jesuits the land for the new mission at La Pointe de Montreal, near the present Ambassador Bridge that hovers over us. In 1767 the mission, which served both the French settlers and the native people, was granted a new status, and the first parish in Canada west of Montreal, Assumption Parish, was erected. Nineteen years later in 1786 two schools, one for girls and one for boys, were begun at Assumption Parish.

Later that year, the Jesuits left Assumption and relinquished control of the College to the diocese. Father Joseph Malbos C.S.B., the first Basilian president of the new College, succeeded the Jesuits but stayed for only one year. The year of Father Malbos's presidency was most significant

for the College since he had the foresight to have the College incorporated by an Act of the Parliament of Upper Canada, which received Royal Assent, August 16, 1858. The Act of Incorporation provided an anchor of stability for the fledgling College as Benedictines, Jesuits and diocesan clergy, successively, assumed direction of the College over the next twelve years.

In 1868, Bishop John Walsh D.D., second bishop of the diocese of London, Ontario invited the Basilian Fathers to assume control of Assumption College. In 1870, Father Dennis O'Connor C.S.B., who later became Bishop of London and Archbishop of Toronto, became president. With Father O'Connor were six other Basilian priests and four scholastics (seminarians).

The new Basilian community immediately began planning for a larger and more permanent structure for the College. Construction of the main building that stands today was begun in 1883, with the Chapel wing completed in 1908.

On July 1, 1953 through an Act of the Ontario Legislature, Assumption College received its own university powers and ended the affiliation with the University of Western Ontario which began in 1919. The following year Assumption College was admitted to full membership in the National Conference of Canadian Universities and Colleges; the University Matriculation Board of Ontario; and the Association of Universities of the British Commonwealth.

In 1956 the College changed its name to Assumption University of Windsor by an Act of the Ontario Legislature. The new University accepted the non-denominational Essex College, incorporated in 1954, as an affiliated college.

In the 1960's, the increasing demands for higher education necessitated a further restructuring of the University. An Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario incorporated the University of Windsor on December 19, 1962. The new non-denominational University included Assumption University as a federated member holding in abeyance its degree granting powers save for the Faculty of Theology. The facilities and teaching faculty of Assumption University were integrated into the University of Windsor.

The development of a non-denominational provincial university out of an historic Roman Catholic university was unprecedented. Today Assumption University remains the only university federated with the University of Windsor. Canterbury College and Iona College continue in their affiliated status. One could say that Assumption University has experienced many assumptions over its long history... having been "assumed" into new realities that its founders never imagined.

Today many ask: what is Assumption University? In 2007, Assumption University celebrated its sesquicentennial. While celebrating its past achievements the University looks forward to building upon the rich theological, cultural and interdisciplinary endeavours that constitute its distinguished history. The service to Church and society, locally, nationally and internationally that characterizes Assumption University will continue in new and creative ventures responding to current needs and forging new frontiers in education. Our relationship with the university community and with Catholic School Boards is key to our future.

Our efforts at Assumption University today are inspired by the vision of Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman who dreamed of establishing a Catholic university in which theology, the arts and sciences would all be taught in dialogue with one another. This is the true meaning of "universitas" – a meeting place, a crossroads, an important bridge to the world around us. The core values of the founders of the Basilian Fathers are goodness, discipline and knowledge. These three values recall for us the importance of the education of the whole person in the Catholic and Basilian approach and remind us not to rely solely on our own efforts, but humbly to ask God, the source of all good gifts, to teach us and guide us.

Ad multos annos, University of Windsor!
Never forget your roots! They remain strong and continue to produce much fruit for Canada and far beyond!

University of Windsor

BY RICHARD BAIN

Campus life is measured in more than seasons or semesters. It's lectures given, exams passed, research breakthroughs, goals scored, weekend get-togethers, friends made and dreams fulfilled.

Author and photographer Richard Bain set out 18 months ago to capture just that. The result is *University of Windsor*, a 120-page hardcover celebration of a year in the University's life.

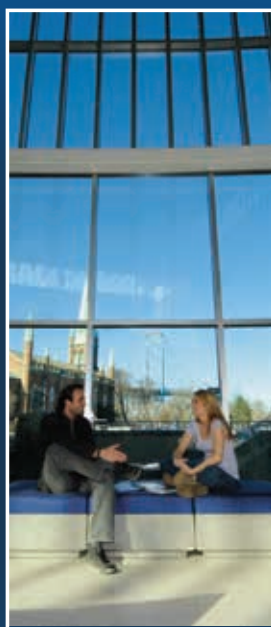
